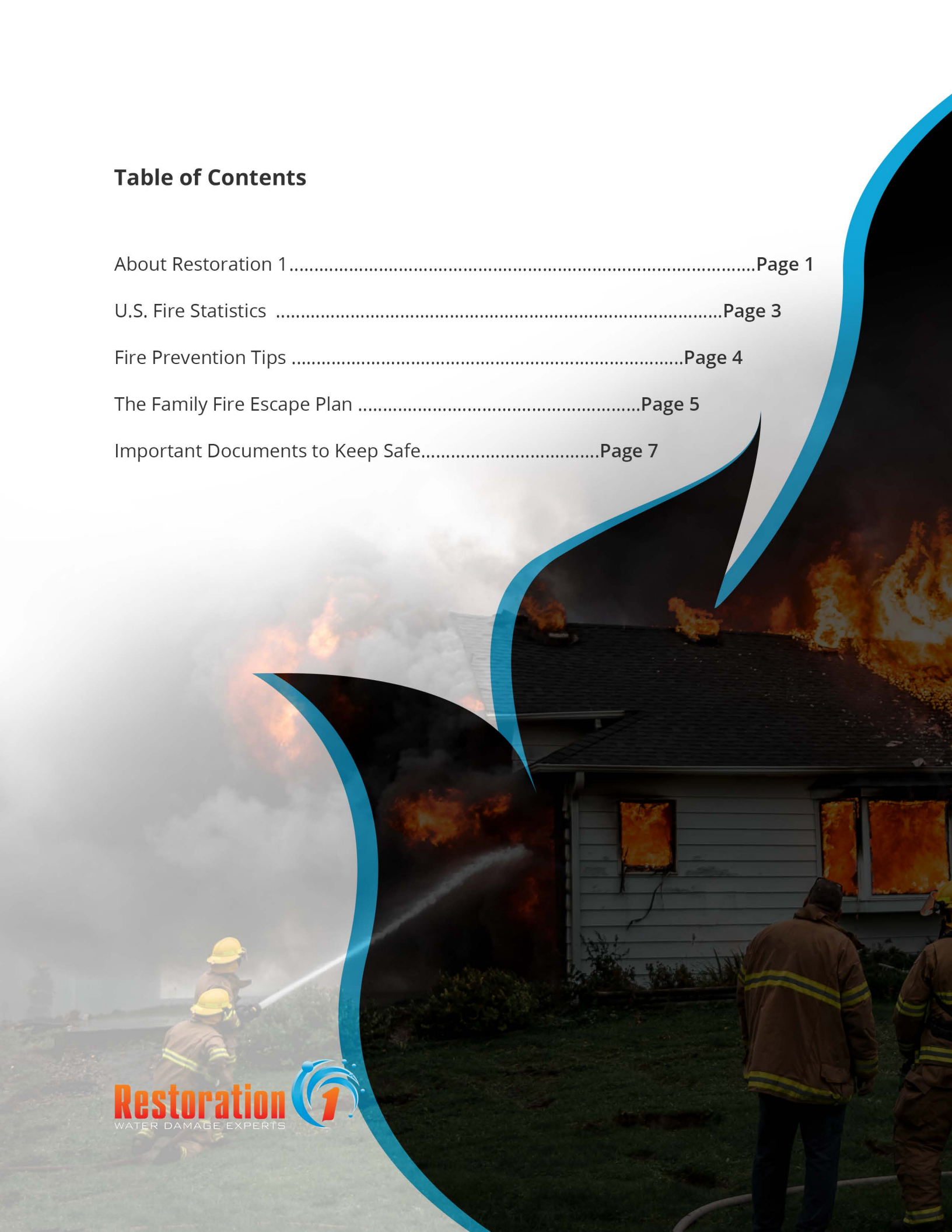

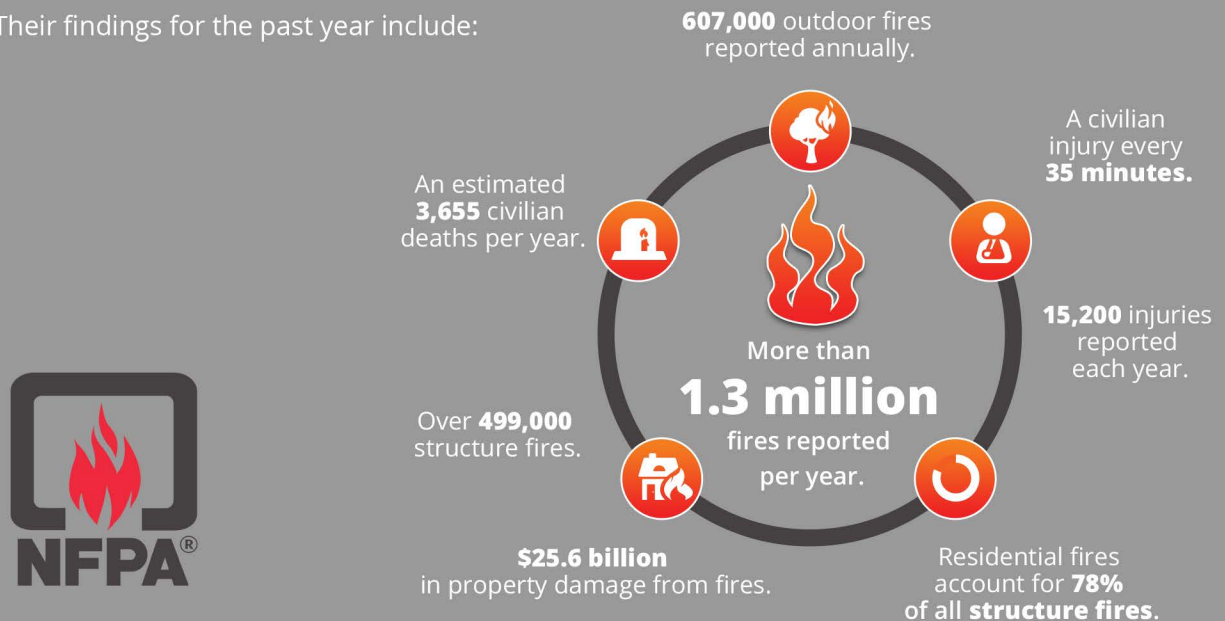

Each year, the *National Fire Protection Association* conducts a thorough investigation into the number and severity of structural and non-structural fires in the United States, sampling public fire departments to receive national estimates.

## Fire Prevention Tips

- Install smoke alarms on every floor of your home and inside bedrooms and hallways.
- Each month, test your smoke alarms and replace dead or low batteries as needed.
- Pay close attention in the kitchen.
- Keep a watchful eye on lit candles, active fireplaces or other open flames.
- Keep space heaters at least three feet from any flammable objects.



## The Family Fire Escape Plan

A key part of the fire safety process is having a thorough family fire escape plan. It's not enough for just you to know the plan, though. Your entire family — children included — should understand the process.

- **Create an Escape Plan** — Take some time to walk through every room of the house with your whole family. Discuss key exits and escapes from each room. If you have young children, consider making a map.
- **Meeting Place** — Outside of the home, you should choose a meeting place as part of your escape plan. An ideal meeting place will be well away from the property, such as a neighbor's home or a tree by the road.
- **Practice Your Plan** — At least twice per year, take time to practice your fire escape plan with the entire family. Practice yelling “fire” and having the children enact the plan. It's also a good idea to practice crawling under smoke and testing door handles for excess heat.



## Child Safety

If the adults are not at home and a fire erupts, being sure that your children are safe and know how to react can make a big difference.

- Children should be a part of the fire escape plan and your semi-annual practices.
- Emphasize “get out, stay out” with all of the children to ensure no one returns for a prized toy or pet.
- Teach kids STOP, DROP and ROLL.

## Pets Are Part of the Plan, Too

You’re not the only one affected by a house fire. Your pet will lose their home, too.

- The best way to protect your pets during a fire is to include them in your fire escape plan.
- When you practice your fire escape plan, take them with you to practice evacuating while carrying a dog or cat.
- Keep collars on pets and leashes readily available.
- Consider a pet alert window cling. You can write the number of pets inside the home on the static cling and place it in your front window.







## Important Documents to Keep Safe

In the event of a fire, there are key documents you should protect so you don't have to worry about them later.

Investing in a fireproof safe is a sound way to protect:

- Birth Certificates
- Social Security Cards
- Passports
- Living and Last Wills
- Tax Returns
- Property Deeds
- Financial Account Information
