- Keep children and flammable objects well away from an active stove and oven.
- Clean up grease spills fast!
- If you deep fry a turkey, ensure the fryer is well away from structures, trees and flammable objects.

## **Safety Tips for Indoor Trees During the Holidays**

- If you prefer a real tree, make sure to water it each day.
- It is fine to use string lights, but do not plug more than three into each other.
- Discard worn or broken string lights.
- Unplug the lights before you sleep or leave home.
- Consider an artificial tree, which adheres to strict safety standards.



# **Safety Tips for Holiday Lighting**

An estimated 780 house fires per year begin because of holiday decorations and lighting.

- Do not overload a circuit the average household can power 70 strings of bulbs or 300 to 600 lines of 50-bulb LED lighting.
- Shut off all holiday lighting and decorations before you leave home or sleep.
- Do not waste your money on cheap extension cords.
- Buy light strings certified with the gold, holographic UL label.



# **Safety Tips for Heating Your Home During the Holidays**

Heating is the second leading cause of house fires in the country, especially during December, January and February.

- Candles Do not leave lit candles unattended.
- Fireplace Keep your fuel source away from the fire and a fire screen in place.
- Heating Equipment Your space heater should be at least three feet from
- flammable objects.
